From the Manse.....

The long summer of sport has begun. We have the Euro 2024 football finals in Germany as well as the Olympic and Para-Olympic Games in Paris, not to mention Wimbledon, the Tour de France and all the cricket that this summer offers.

For some this will bring a sense of great joy and pleasure and for others it is something to be avoided at all costs, an annoyance as their usual TV programs are rescheduled or postponed.

I'm writing this letter the day after Scotland crashed out of the Euro 2024 finals and England await their last group match. Much has been made of this so-called golden generation of England football stars, those who play regularly week by week with great skill and aplomb at the highest level for their clubs, those who have reached the very pinnacle of what it means to be a professional footballer.

However, when they put on an England shirt it appears that this group of talented individuals suddenly and inexplicably seem somewhat ordinary, pedestrian and not good enough.

Competition after competition and tournament after tournament England flatter to deceive. Is it the fault of the players, the manager or the system that is being played or is it simply down to unrealistic expectations of the fans?

Time and time again, we are reminded that the team that wins isn't necessarily the one with all the star players but the one that performs well playing to one another's strengths and with a sense of unity, purpose, pride and passion. When this happens, they can be unstoppable, they can be impressive to watch, and they can be a real tour de force.

Whilst St. Paul makes one or two references to sport (boxing and athletics) he of course has nothing to say about football or tennis or cricket, or does he?

Paul in 1 Corinthians talks a lot about what it means to be a church and uses the analogy of it being like a body, made up of many different parts and how all those parts are necessary for the functioning and well-being of the whole. He reminds us that all the parts (people) are vital and have unique roles to play no matter who they are. How sometimes it is the smaller or less obvious parts of the body that have the most important part to play and how when everybody is performing to their best, when everybody in the life of the church is giving of their all and when people work together in unity and harmony, then the church becomes what God has called it to be.

Perhaps we find that we can no longer do what we used to but, even when this is taken into consideration, there is much that can be done, for we all have our gifts to offer, our own ministry to exercise and as Methodists we believe in the concept of the ministry of the whole people of God. I remember when I was line-manager for Debbie Thrower (the first ever Anna Chaplain), she told us how an elderly lady of 101 who was almost blind discovered on moving into a care home a new ministry for herself. Each and every night she would walk down her corridor knocking on the doors of her neighbours and simply say "good night and God bless you."

I never believed that England would win the Euro 2024 finals, maybe reaching the last eight is the best that we can hope for, but when they take heed of St. Paul and learn to play as a team and not as individuals, then maybe just maybe, we can hope that "Football's coming home!"

The Methodist Church in Great Britain celebrates 50 years of women's ordination as ministers

The Methodist Church in Britain is proud to mark the 50th anniversary of the ordination of women as ministers (presbyters). Although women were permitted to become deacons in the Methodist Church from 1890, they were not ordained as presbyters until 2 July 1974 at the Methodist Conference in Bristol.

The anniversary will be celebrated at the Methodist Conference which is this year taking place in Leeds. A specially written prayer will be included during the Sunday service at the Conference and a new short film featuring four female ministers will be released. The Preacher in the Presbyteral Session is the Revd Ruth Gee, a former President of the Conference (2013). She was invited to preach by the current President Gill Newton to mark the anniversary. The bible that was presented on the 40th anniversary will be on display throughout the Conference.

The film shares the experiences of past Presidents, the Revd Sonia Hicks and the Revd Michaela Youngson along with the Revd Kathryn Stephens and the Revd Kan Yu who talk about their calling to the ministry as well as the challenges they faced and their work now. A preview can be seen **here**.

Revd Sonia Hicks says, "Despite the lows, I remain deeply grateful that this Methodist Church allows me to exercise this calling to ministry. I have ministered in different countries and met amazing people. It continues to be a great honour and privilege."

Revd Kathryn Stephens says, "There is never a dull moment in ministry! The challenges are wide and varied, some difficult and painful, others filled with wonderful joy and opportunity. Through the highs and lows of ministry, I try to remember my calling, be deeply rooted in Jesus and seek the strength of God in all things."

Revd Kan Yu says, "I am compassionate about nurturing and valuing the diverse gifts and heritage of God's people to build up Christ's body with love and justice to serve the present age. I am keen to find God in all things and enable others to discern God's call upon them."

Methodist ministers are being asked to share their memories for the anniversary, which will be featured on the Methodist Church website.

Since 1974, 10 women presbyters have been elected as President of the Conference and 6 of them over the past 10 years – Revd Loraine Mellor in 2017, Revd Michaela Youngson in 2018, Revd Dr Barbara Glasson in 2019, Revd Sonia Hicks in 2021, Revd Gill Newson in 2023 and Revd Helen Cameron in 2024.

How we helped on the streets

Street Pastors met a young man who was homeless and had slept on the streets for 4 nights. Being the beginning of a very cold spell, we attempted to find emergency accommodation for him. The Police joined us and also attempted to find somewhere for the man to stay, unsuccessfully. We used our mobile power pack to put some charge into the man's phone. He was able to call a friend and arrange to sleep in their shed for the night. We gave him some soup, snacks, a jumper and a pair of gloves to help keep him warm.

In Grove one evening, Street Pastors saw a young lad fall off his new bike. We went over to check he was ok and used our torches to help him check if his bike was ok too.

One of our teams visited Sweatbox Youth Centre and spent time chatting with the young people and staff. The same night we cleared up a lot of broken glass in the Undercroft Car Park – our kit bag includes a dustpan and brush for this very reason.

Another night in Wantage town centre, we found that some of the plants in one of the Wantage planters had been uprooted, perhaps by a frustrated reveller. Before heading home for the night, one of our Street Pastors replanted the plants.

Street Pastors met a group of three young people at Grove Skate Park. We chatted for some time and gave them lollies. We also cleared up broken glass at the Skate Park. The same night Street Pastors cleared up lots of litter at Mary Green Park and the Old Mill Hall.

Community involvement

Wantage & Grove Street Pastors works alongside and supports a number of local, regional and national groups. We regularly contribute to the Neighbourhood Action Group, which seeks to identify and resolve issues that arise in our local communities. Our early Friday evening team visits Sweatbox whenever possible to connect with the young people and encourage youth workers.

Afternoon Patrols

It has been a long-held **ambition** of ours to have Street Pastor patrols in Wantage town centre on Friday afternoons.

Our purpose is always to care, to listen and to help. We will be available to whomever we meet, albeit children on their way home from school, members of the public waiting for a bus, for example, or shopkeepers.

During term-time, there will be lots of young people leaving King Alfred's Academy and making their way through town on foot or by bike. We will be there to provide a reassuring presence for everyone and a listening ear for anyone who needs to talk.

During 2023/24, our chair, Paul Gander has championed this aspect of our ministry and signed up as the first afternoon patrols Street Pastor recruit. We have gained 3 further recruits and have started training and equipping in order to start patrols later in the calendar year.

Financial overview



We ended the 2023-24 financial year with a deficit of £6,522 compared with a surplus £650 in the previous financial year. The table below summarises our income and expenditure.

We continue to receive grant funding from Oxfordshire County Council and also from the TVP Community Action Fund. We also received some smaller but welcome grants from other supporters of WGSP. The

reduction in grant income is a result of changes in the timing of the Oxfordshire County Council grant.

We are grateful to those supporters who give by standing order (19 in total) who have mostly maintained their giving at the same level as last year and also to other supporters making one-off donations.

Some areas of expenditure have increased, in particular staff costs due to inflation and the development of our social media presence. Higher Operating costs and Ascension Trust fees are mainly caused by timing issues.

We are grateful for the continuing support we receive from members, the public and charitable bodies, especially at this time when many are experiencing reductions in their income together with greater demands on available charitable funds. Our work continues to be recognised and valued at all levels within the community. Thank you!

2023 AGM

Our 2022/23 AGM took place on 4th July 2023 at St John's Church in Grove. Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO)

The new CIO charity was registered with the Charity Commission on 6 November 2023 and has Charity Number 1205598. Work now begins to set up the new charity and to transfer existing assets, employees, etc to the new organisation.

majority of the surplus could be explained by much higher café revenue. Our staff worked tirelessly all year to deliver more outside catering than ever before whilst keeping on top of a busy café. Sadly, a number of staff moved on during the year, but we also welcomed two new staff and will be looking to recruit one more in the autumn. 


Marble Jar

Many of you will know we have a scheme to "pay it forward" to cater in the café for those in need which we call the marble jar. We have been using this scheme to pay for families entitled to free school meals to come in during the holidays and also others in need, such as unemployed or homeless people who are signposted to us by churches or the Advice Centre. It's been very successful. Since the beginning of April, the scheme has been used by individuals or families 35 times. Due to the generosity of our customers and friends we do still have some money in the marble jar fund but it



has been depleted significantly. We anticipate this scheme will be popular again in the summer so we would appreciate more donations, which can be made at the till.



In the bookshop

We have a Take Note promotion running until the end of July with a good selection of books and CDs including the much-anticipated new edition of the "Life Application Study Bible" which has £5 off.
