

# From the Manse.....

Many of you will know that Liz and I are great Bruce Springsteen fans – at the end of July this year we, along with around 90,000 other people, watched him perform another non-stop, heart pumping, adrenaline filled three-and-a-half-hour extravaganza of a concert at Wembley.

Not bad for someone who will soon be celebrating his 75<sup>th</sup> birthday!

His music has always been influenced by social justice and his Catholic upbringing and can be readily seen in his lyrics and the theme of his songs.

As he has gotten older, he has become more reflective regarding his mortality and at the end of a documentary that follows the making of the album "Letter to you" he speaks eloquently about this.

What struck me the other day whilst re-reading this is that it is also a rallying cry about making the most of the here and now, of each day and every moment.

Sometimes and for very good reasons, we find ourselves in church either looking back to what was or trying to grasp the vision of the future which is tantalisingly close and failing to live in the present.

So, at the beginning of a new Methodist year with all the changes and challenges that lie ahead, I offer these words of Bruce Springsteen as a reminder to make the most of every day, to be grateful for the blessings we have and to ensure that we also live in the moment.

Age brings perspective And the fine clarity one gets at midnight On the tracks looking into the lights of an oncoming train It dawns on you rather quickly, there's only so much time left Only so many star filled nights, snow falls, brisk fall afternoons, Rainy midsummer days, So how you conduct yourself and do your work matters How you treat your friends, your family, your lover, On good days, a blessing falls over you, It wraps its arms around you and you are free And deeply of and in this world And that's your reward, being here That's what gets you up the next morning A new chance to receive that benediction While you're buttering your toast, getting dressed Or driving home from work, you stumble into those moments When you can feel the hand of God gently resting on your shoulder And you realize how lucky you are. Lucky to be alive, lucky to be breathing in this world of beauty, horror, and hope Because this is what there is, a chance, A world where its lucky to love, lucky to be loved So you go, until it fills you

Until the sweat, blood, and tears make sense You go until the light from the fading distant stars Fall at your feet Go And may God bless you."

This decision was not taken lightly, but nonetheless it was the right one, reflecting the wishes of those who have helped the chapel to keep going these past few years and for which we are very grateful.

Please note that this Is not the same as closing and selling the building. It is hoped (and in doing so to be faithful to the wishes of those stalwarts from the chapel who have died in recent years) that we will find new ways of enabling the Methodist name and presence (in conjunction with St. Mary's) to continue in a new way on the site. We have already begun some discussions about this with the District Mission Team.

It is right that we give thanks to God for the faithful witness of the chapel which this year celebrates 30 years of the opening of the new building, 175 years of Methodism on this site and 215 years of Methodism within the village

# Things a Church Can Do to be More Inclusive for Neurodivergent People

- Create quieter spaces in the church by having an area in the worship space where speakers are not directed at
- Name tags and/or role tags for stewards
- To have the last row (or area by the entrance to the worship space) that is reserved for those who come in late
- Coloured overlays (of different colours) available (especially if there are hymn books/service sheets/etc.)
- Fidget toys to be available
- Area in the building to go for quiet time
- Training on impulsivity/inattentiveness of congregation for key people (e.g. stewards, ministers, etc.) as to help others to understand these behaviours
- Break the sermon/talk up into smaller chunks 5 minutes at a time
- Give clear and concise instructions and have these written down (if possible)
- To follow a similar routine each service (if possible); if it is not followed, to have an explanation as to why
- Try not to use phrases like 'break a leg' that has a metaphorical meaning – be literal
- To be aware of sensory stimulation: smells, light, sound, touch, etc. to not be overwhelming
- If at something like a Bible study, not expecting everyone to read and making this clear
- Important dates listed on a board, in clear font and not too visually cluttered
- Fix flickering lights either by not having them on or replacing bulb/starting motor
- For tea and coffee after church, have mug options and not only cups and saucers
- Have the audio at the lowest level possible, whilst still be audible for others i.e. not to have the speakers, etc. noisy for the sake of it
- To make it clear that when sharing the peace, physical contact is not compulsory (easier post-Covid)
- Transitioning from the service to the social isn't always instant give people time and space if they need it; signs may be remaining seated after a service, going to the loo shortly after, etc.
- When advertising services, be clear about what you will be doing; e.g. if there are periods of silence, say so.



The café does not charge for coffee, cake or toast but any donations go to a charity. In June, July and August donations will go to our own church funds. At the time of writing we will have raised over £310. At the June Church Council meeting it was agreed that the following charities would be supported in the next Connexional year: Freyja's fund (a local charity based at the JR which provides grants to children with cancer); Siyabonga (a small charity providing support to children in Uganda); Parkinsons Me (a local charity who run the garden in Ardington and also run movement classes for people with Parkinsons) and Church funds.

Many thanks to all who volunteer at the café. It is much appreciated. Thanks also to those who have volunteered to be back ups in case we need someone at the last minute. We continue to miss Eileen's presence at the café and hope she will be able to visit the café soon.
