#### A statement from the Methodist Church on Assisted Dying proposals

#### 14 November 2024

#### *Revd Dr Jonathan Hustler:* Secretary of the Methodist Conference

A Bill to legalise a form of assisted dying will be debated and voted on in the UK Parliament on 29 November. This follows the introduction of a proposed Bill in the Scottish Parliament in March 2024 which would allow terminally ill adults in Scotland to end their own lives, and the approval of similar plans to proceed with the drafting of legislation to enable assisted dying in Jersey in May 2024, and on the Isle of Man in July 2024.

Historically the Methodist Church has opposed any change to the law on this issue. In 2015, when assisted dying was last seriously considered in the House of Commons, the Methodist Conference discussed the issue, and heard contributions on both sides of the debate. While there was consensus around affirming the intrinsic value of human life, and the importance of high quality palliative care, two extracts from the motions put forward illustrate the very sincere beliefs held both by those who believe the law should change to allow assisted suicide, and those who see that as a slippery slope:

"[Assisted dying] would have a seriously detrimental effect on the wellbeing of individuals and on the nature and shape of our society, and can only add to the pressures that many vulnerable terminally ill people will feel" [Notice of Motion 2015/212]

"Where death is considered both certain and imminent, a compassionate due judicial dispensation to allow assisted end-of-life could be appropriate" [Notice of Motion 2015/221]

The Methodist Conference referred the matter to the Methodist Council, which decided not to revisit the Church's position, but requested the production of resources to enable the Church better to respond to the needs of those requiring palliative care and understand the issues involved, in the wider context of the subject of death and dying.

As this issue is debated in Parliament again, we commend those resources for study and informed reflection. The web pages will be updated with additional resources and information over the coming days.

We also urge that this important issue is debated with sensitivity and kindness, recognising its potential to prompt pain and strong feelings in the people most closely affected by it.

# A Statement in response to the resignation of the Archbishop of Canterbury from the Methodist Church in Britain

#### 14 November 2024

In light of the resignation of the Archbishop of Canterbury following the Makin Review into abuses by the late John Smyth QC, the Methodist Church in Britain joins others in praying for all those affected by abuse. Survivors have been courageous in speaking of their experience and in calling the Churches to account and we hope humbly to continue to learn from them.

We are covenant partners with the Church of England, an anniversary we marked last week. Dr Welby has done much to strengthen the partnership between our denominations and we pray for the continuation of this work and for those who will discern who should be the next Archbishop of Canterbury. We are committed to developing our shared understanding and desire for good safeguarding practice at every level of our churches.

#### A prayer

Loving God, we ask your forgiveness for the times when in your Church we have failed to protect vulnerable people.

We pray for your healing for those who have been hurt and for those who live with guilt and regret.

We ask for your wisdom and direction as we seek to keep safe all your children, in the name of Christ. Amen.



On the final Sunday in October there were two Services, each of them with a special focus. Our morning service included the baptism of Martha Heaver. This was witnessed by very many of her family members and friends. The many comments afterwards confirmed their appreciation of being so warmly welcomed, and the uplifting Service celebrating the special occasion for Martha, and everyone who was there to support her entry into our church family through infant baptism.

To date Derek has no new appointment and can only continue to wait patiently, but also painfully.

We have been pleased to welcome Jennie Sapsford to our morning Services for a few weeks, and hope that she will continue to worship with us. Having moved to Wantage fairly recently, our Community Café has been a helpful way of enabling Jennie to get to know other church family members.

Jane Robinson's annual visit to Glyndbourne concluded badly through knocking her leg, causing a nasty injury. This has necessitated many hospital visits, and with greatly impaired mobility, once again Jane isn't able to worship with us in person. We assure her of our love, and hope swift healing will enable her return to Church soon.

We are currently missing two neighbours and friends temporarily unable to be with us in Church. Whilst taking her dog for a walk a few weeks ago, Mary Trotter fell on the pavement and has a broken wrist. As well as the difficulties in having to manage many tasks onehandedly, Mary feels sorry that this accident also shatters her 90 year long record of avoiding any broken bones! With care and assistance from Mary T and Mary Whittaker, Diane Barton has been able to join in worship with us until recently. Diane's daughter Claire is currently taking a much needed and deserved rest from being her Mum's sole carer. During this time Diane is staying at St Katharine's. We pray for Mary and Diane and all who are offering them support.

Eileen Rennie's return to Church has been welcomed as a sign of her improving health, and we pray that this will continue. We are thankful for Helen Carter's sound recovery which has enabled her return to local preaching, with her first service being at Wantage. We hope that she will go on progressing towards good health. Treatment is ongoing for Sue Haithwaite and June Grunwald whom we hold in our thoughts and offer our love and our prayers. We look forward to when they are both well enough to worship with us regularly again.

We are aware that, in addition to those we have named, there are others going through difficult times at present, but whose anonymity is preserved. We offer them reassurance that, in holding before God every member of our Church family, they will be supported by our collective prayers, and our hopes for their return to better health.
